

1920 Rompers for 7" Doll

One eighth seams allowed on all patterns. Use one strand of embroidery floss for all embroidery.

Baste under narrow seam allowance on yoke. Place yoke and romper together with the *right* side of the yoke on the *wrong* side of the romper. Backstitch together around the neck. Turn to the front and baste or glue in place. Work buttonhole stitches all the way around the outer edges.

Turn under and baste a narrow hem in the top of the sleeve trim. Lay the sleeve trim on the sleeve bottoms, with the *right* side of the trim against the *wrong* side of the garment. Sew together along the bottom. Turn to outside and baste or glue in place. Work buttonhole stitches along edge.

Turn under a narrow hem on outside edge of back facing. Lay facing on center back of romper, right sides facing. The top edges should be even. Backstitch along each side of centerline. Make a sharp point at bottom. Cut down between the rows of stitching. Sew a button and loop to center back for closure.

Sew underarm seams. Sew crotch seam. Make narrow hems in romper legs. Run elastic thread through the hem and draw up to fit doll's leg. Tie off.

There are four tucks indicated on the romper pattern. These are optional. Place the rompers on your doll and tuck to make the romper fit the doll.

Turn under seam allowances on belt. Fold together and buttonhole stitch all around edge. Work a simple buttonhole on one end. Sew a button to other end.

Sew the four crown sections together. Sew center back seam on both crown pieces. Sew two crown pieces together along outside edge, right sides facing. Turn. Buttonhole stitch along outside of brim. Make small clips around inside curve of brim. Attach to bottom of crown by sewing around the outside of brim and bottom of crown, right sides facing. Then turn under seam allowance on remaining loose edge and whip in place to inside of brim bottom, concealing raw edge.
